Our team leader, Ms Jenni Carlock R.N. EMT, in a very professional manner facilitated much of the logistics on the ground both in the US and Haiti. She was able to diplomatically work with our major contact on the ground, Airline Ambassadors and other relief agencies in Haiti to assure the groups safety, lodging, transportation and make arrangements to see that our individual skill sets were best utilized. Ms. Carlock had to navigate a system where communications was often difficult because moment –to-moment conditions were changing as well as the information that was being given to her.

All the while she was concentrated on keeping us together and the mission focused. This was no small task with ten professionals who equally had personal goals for themselves on this medical relief mission. Much to her credit she remained flexible when needed but aggressive in advocating with officials who had their own agenda for utilizing the groups various talents.

Because of her I was able to fully meet my professional and personal objective as a primary care physician of relieving suffering and aiding the most acutely ill. I would welcome the opportunity to accompany her on another mission to further the much-needed building of a medical infrastructure consistent with your organizational planned involvement in Haiti.

I would like to thank you and your team from Jewish Renaissance Medical Center for all the work you have done during this past week for the rescue work for victims of the earthquakes in Haiti.

Your team of surgeons and registered nurses provided excellent care to our community that suffered the tragedy of the massive earthquake that killed approximately 300,000 Haitians. You treated 300-400 patients every day in the outdoor Emergency Room from newborns to adults of all types of emergencies. The medical care that your team provided was superb and under extreme conditions in the hot outdoors and in tents, and took care of patients that were post operative requiring stay in the tents for days to weeks.

The surgeons performed many life saving operations in our operating room, including but not limited amputations, revascularizations of limbs, emergency appendectomy, and surgical repair of many major traumatic wounds.

The nursing staff provided nursing care from triage, treatment of all sorts, including but not limited to Intravenous fluids, antibiotics, dressing changes, pain control, emotional support to those who lost loved ones, casting and splinting, wound care, hydration and much more.

Many thanks for all the medical supplies and medications that were donated by your organization.

I would also like to thank you for *personally* obtaining two truck loads of food to feed our patients when we ran out of food. What you did was selfless.
